- EIOPA initiated some work on recovery and resolution since it was set-up
- A dedicated Project Group was established in January 2016

Overview of existing national frameworks

EIOPA conducted a stock taking exercise to obtain information on existing national recovery and resolution frameworks in the EU.

The survey covers crisis management aspects like early intervention, resolution, cross-border cooperation and IGS.

Rationale for harmonisation

EIOPA analyses whether there is a need for a harmonised recovery and resolution framework for insurers.

Pros: Avoidance of fragmentation, enhancement of cross-border coordination, fragile market environment.

Cons: Normal insolvency procedures might be suitable, national frameworks might reflect national specificities in a better way, administrative burdens and costs.

Building blocks of recovery & resolution

EIOPA analyses what the building blocks could be for a minimum harmonised recovery and resolution framework.

Building blocks of recovery and resolution



General principles

- Scope:
 - o All (<u>re</u>)insurers, including branches of third-country insurers situated in the EU
 - o Excluded: small insurers not subject to Solvency II
 - o Subject to proportionality principle
- Proportionality principle:
 - o Power to waive requirements (e.g. for pre-emptive recovery plans and resolution plans)
 - o Simplified obligations
 - o Powers to be applied in proportionate manner

Building blocks of recovery and resolution (cont'd)



- For each of the proposed building blocks, questions for stakeholders are included to gather their view
- Based on this, the proposed building blocks and/or their content might change
