




Conference on Global Insurance Supervision

After the great success of last year's Conference on Transatlantic Insurance Group Supervision, the International Center for Insurance Regulation (ICIR) would like to extend the geographical scope of this year's conference and to concentrate on a more global perspective. Therefore, in close cooperation with the European Insurance and Occupational Pension Authority (EIOPA), we are organizing a Conference on Global Insurance Supervision.

The objective of the conference is to encourage the exchange between supervisors and leading professionals of the insurance industry on the subject of Global Insurance Supervision. Through an in-depth discussion of the major issues in global supervision in break-out sessions and open discussions, we intend to arrive at operational solutions.

The supervisors will present current and emerging practices, as well as their views on global supervision and the challenges that global insurance groups pose to insurance supervisors, e.g. with regard to the systemic relevance of international insurance groups.

Insurance company executives and international supervisors will have a unique opportunity to present their views on the supervisory convergence worldwide, the similarities and differences between different jurisdictions, and in how far supervisory convergence can be beneficial to both supervisors and the insurance industry.
