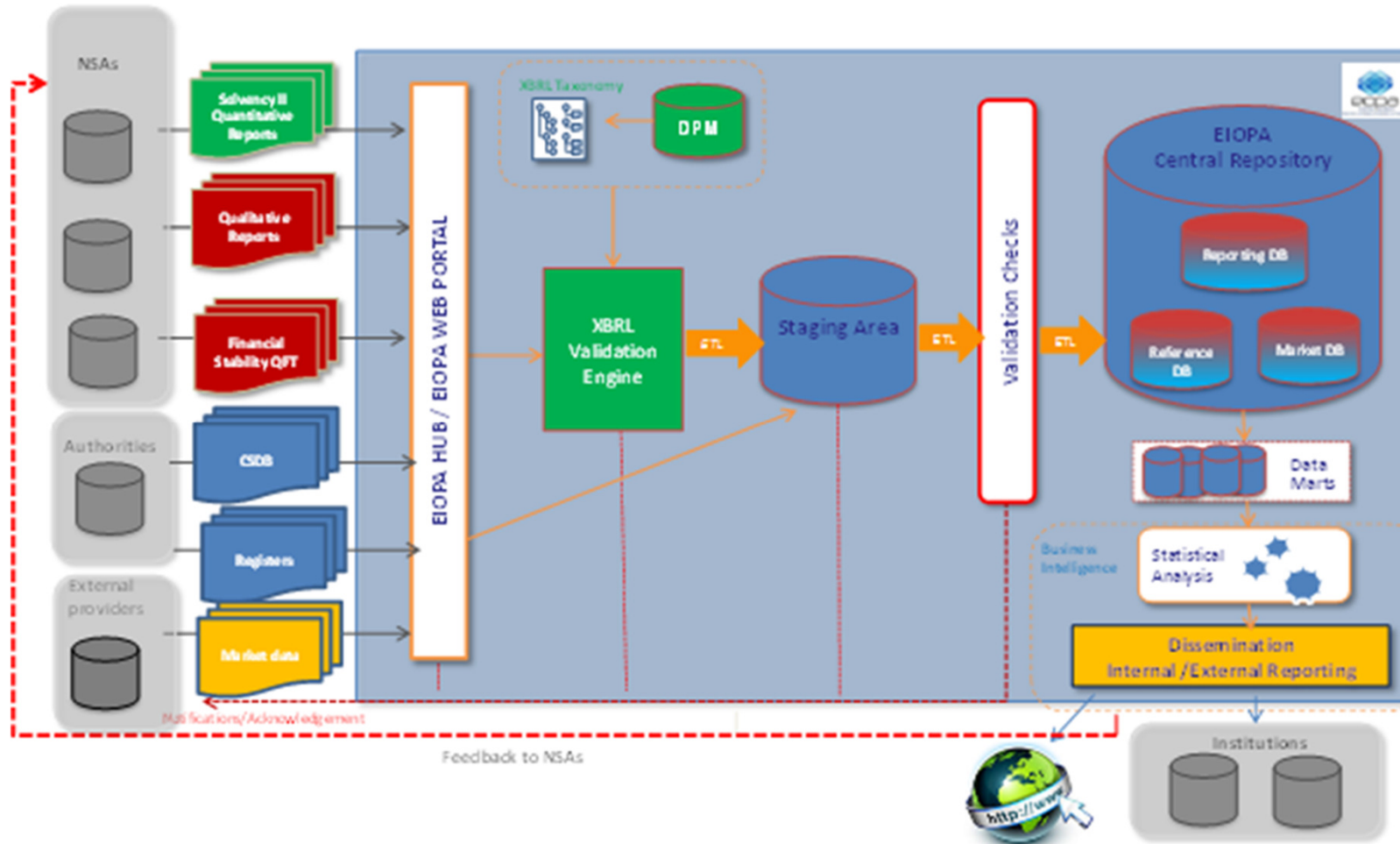

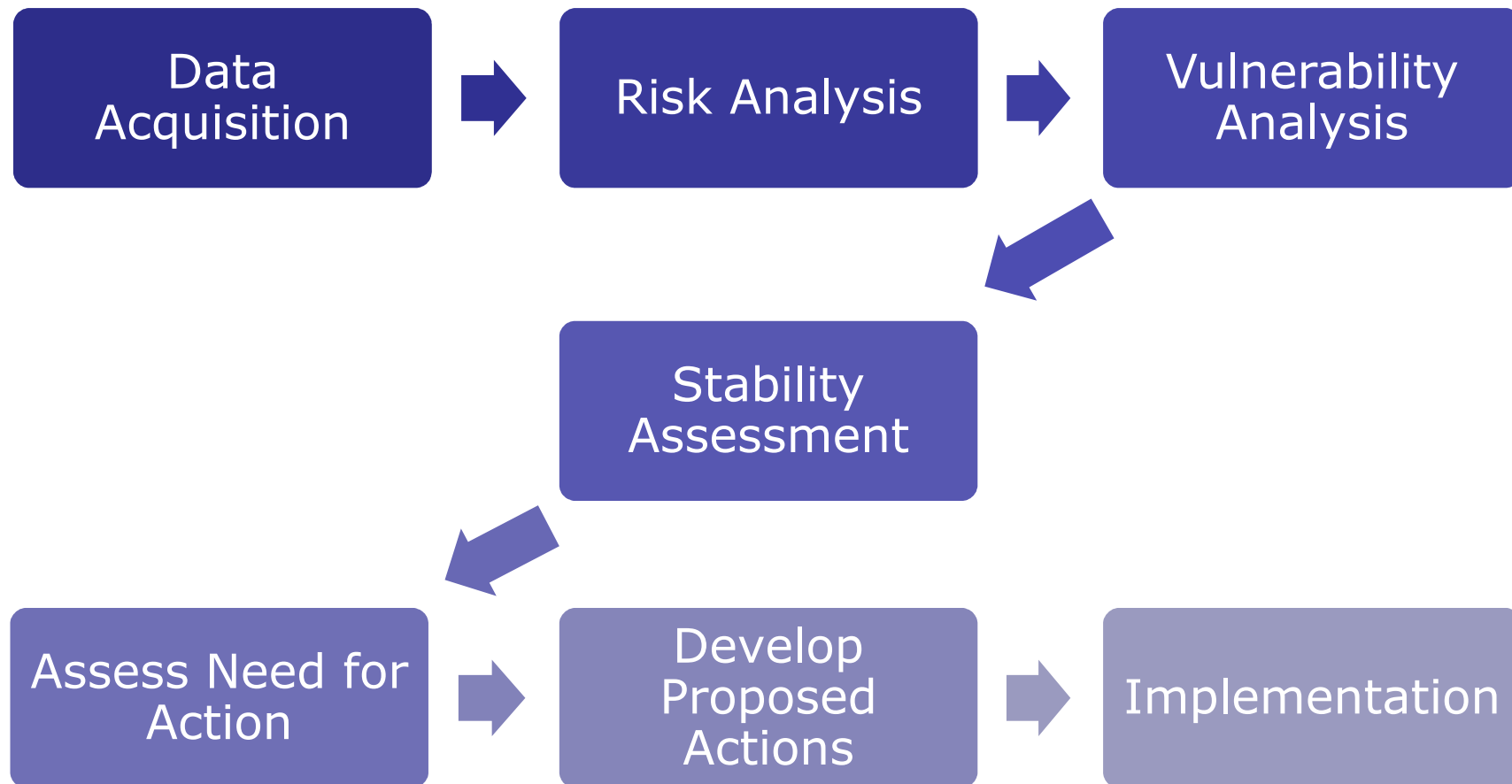

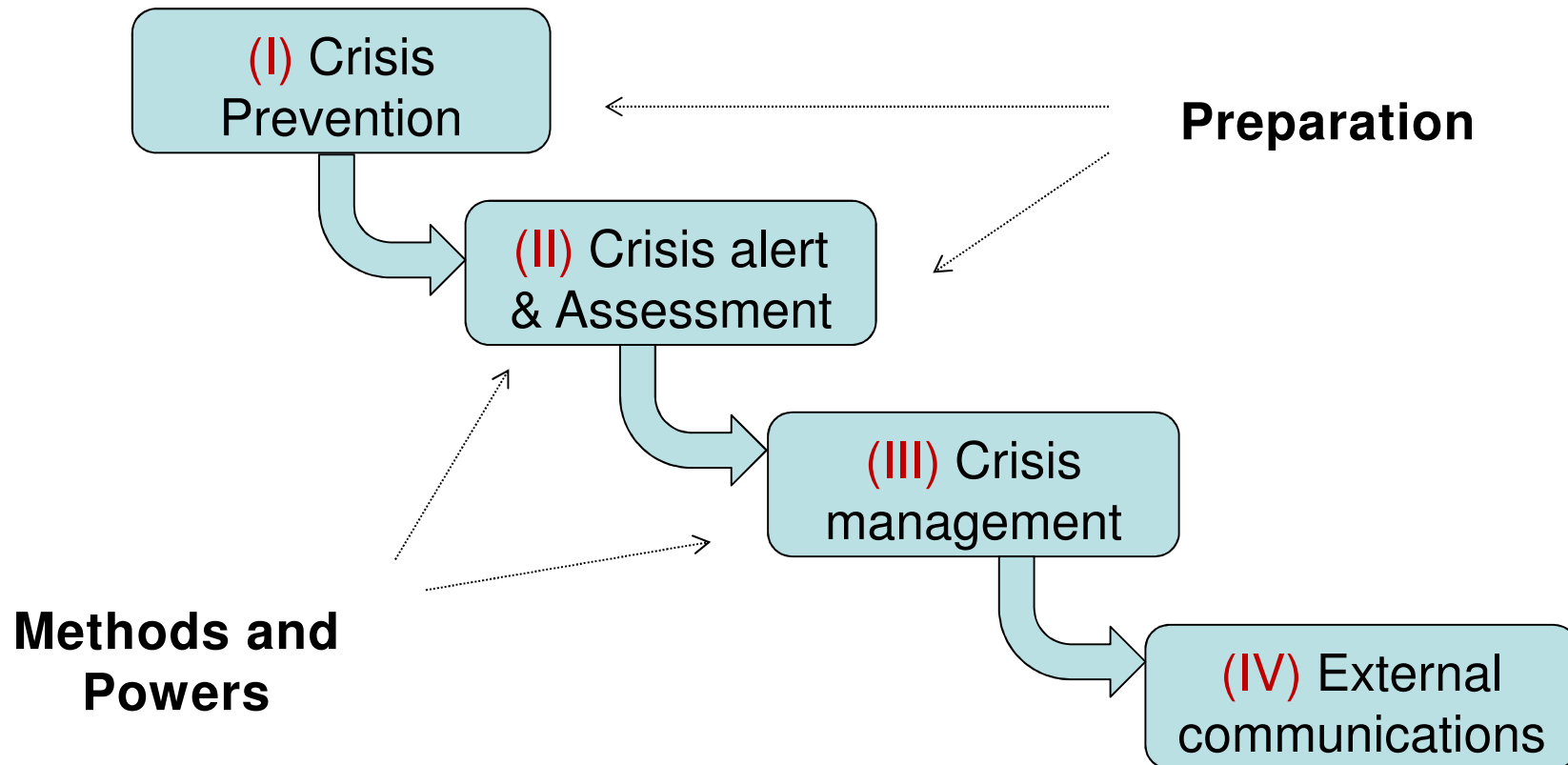
Information and IT Interaction





- Risk, vulnerability and resilience assessment – increased focus on action
- Stress Testing
 - o Insurance – Top down exercise post 2014 test
 - o Insurance – Preparation for 2016 test
 - o Pensions – First stress test exercise
- Preparation for SII Implementation (new data)
 - o Calibration of existing metrics, tools etc.
 - o Development of new tools
- Developing new tools
 - o Early warning system

Crisis Prevention and Management



- Increased focus on action
 - Turning FS, Colleges findings into action
 - GSII Forum coordination
 - Input to debate on macroprudential instruments

- Development of recovery and resolution policy
 - Input to COM
 - Development of failure database
 - Promoting consistency in through GSII work
